We toured the home which remains much period of our cars for the evethe same as when the Lunts entertained Noel Coward, Helen Hayes, Katharine Hepburn and many others from the Broadway stage. Special this year was a collection of Lynn's gowns on loan from Mt. Mary College.





An email was sent out ahead of time with directions to install the app and enter our code.

It was fun to watch everybody making their way around the Lake to Benton Harbor, our starting point, as I was heading there coming from the opposite direction.

I use it a lot at home to see where my wife is on her way home. I can get the grill going ahead of time and get dinner started. It's also fun because my Dad and brother in Florida are on it, I can look them up anytime and see where they are. My brother travels a lot so sometimes when I look him up, he's in Europe or Denver! Hey! What you doing there?


The app worked really well for the 10 or so cars that were on it. I could look at the screen and know everyone was behind me or where the lagging ones were.

On Monday morning I had one car lost but a quick look at the app and I could see they were just down the street a mile away. Easy to give them directions to get back to the main group.

It's not only a map, it also has an emergency alert that will put out a call and text to everyone in the group. We never had to use it but some people did find the check in notification which would put out a text when you checked in and let people know you made it to your destination.





British Car Festival




